This workshop will disavow a prevalent world-view of teaching and learning --with its assumptions, problems, solutions, actions and consequences. We will attempt to disrupt the conventional 'lesson plan' and begin to re-envision, design and enact (role play) a micro-learning situation (mini-class). Questions such as the following will inform our work: What does it look like for learning rather than the measurement of learning to be at the core of education? What does it look like to 'uncover' a curriculum?
