



Using picturebooks in research with migrant learners Dr Helen Hanna, East China Normal University

This taster session will show participants how to use picturebooks to engage migrant learners in educational research. Using the picturebook *The Arrival* (Shaun Tan, 2007) that tells a story of migration, Helen will take participants through the steps that she used in her research with primary school learners in South Africa. This will include annotating parts of the wordless story to discover how the learners thought the man was feeling as he arrived in the new, strange country, and how they believed he could be helped and supported. She will give examples of how this revealed children's views on being new at school, and of how to support them.

Dr Helen Hanna is an Associate Research Fellow at the Institute of International and Comparative Education, East China Normal University. She previously worked as a Lecturer in Education Studies at Leeds Trinity University, during which time she received a British Academy Small Grant to fund the research explored in her workshop today. She is also an educational consultant and trainer in writing for academic publication with the British Council. Her research interests relate to educational diversity and inclusion, particularly of ethnic, racial and national minorities, migrant learners, and those with special educational needs and disabilities.
