We are fortunate to have the Action Research session led by Jack Whitehead and Marie Huxtable. They bring a depth of experience about classroom research and action reflection. They will be sharing their experiences, and no doubt offer practical tips on Action Research as a theory/methodology and method.

The Research into Action session will be hosted by our speakers from the Top Tips & Triggers event:

- Anna-Claire Norden, Headteacher Swavesey Primary School, will be getting delegates to consider the importance and role of school ethos in developing a research active community and how this can be implemented.
- Rachael Foster, Deputy Headteacher and Teaching School Director, Blean Primary School, will provide insight into her Iceberg model, particularly about what is lurking under the water.
- Islean Gibson, Headteacher Kinloch Rannock Primary School, identifies actions that can be taken to enable children in setting the school's priorities so that staff, governors and parents listen to children's views heard and act upon them.
- Gaurav Dubay, Evidence Lead in Education at King Edward VI Handsworth Grammar School for Boys will share how he involved the pupils in an evidence initiative to encourage a school reading culture.
- David Higginbottom considers how the outputs from research can be shared and disseminated to provide a legacy for research.
